THE SYSTEMS THEY USE

GREAT BRITAIN

M. Saunders and J. W. Tait. Acol. 1 NT opening 12-14. Over three-bids, 3 NT is for a take-out, except over 3C when 3D is used. 1 NT - 2C and 2 NT - 3C are Stayman. 2 NT - 3D forces 3H from the opener and responder selects the contract (Flint convention). Sharples convention: 2C or 2D over opposing 1 NT shows support for all suits except the unbid minor. Roman Blackwood 4 NT: response of 5C shows 3 aces or none; 5D shows 4 aces or 1; 5H shows two aces of the same colour or rank; 5S shows two unconnected aces. Unusual no trump bids ask for minor suits. 1S dbl. 2 NT shows a normal raise to 3S. Lead ace from ace-king.

J. Amsbury and C. Hille. Baron. 1 NT opening 12½ - 13½. 1 NT - 2 NT is forcing, asking for four-card suits which are bid upwards. Changes of suit are forcing. 1H - 2 NT shows 15-16 and 1H - 3 NT shows 17-18. Over 1H or 1S, 4C and 4D show a strong raise to game including a singleton and one or two aces (Swiss convention). Weak two bids in major suits. 8 Playing trick hands (normal Acol two-bids) are opened 2D with a single suiter or 2C with a two-suiter. 2C may also be a normal forcing opening. 3C or 3D shows a solid suit, or a near solid suit with an entry. Roman Blackwood and Flint as above. Suit preference discards: e.g., a high spade discard in a diamond contract shows a heart holding.

C. C. Smith and D. Hamilton. Acol. 1 NT opening 12-14. 1 NT - 2C and 2 NT - 3C Stayman. Blackwood. Fourth suit bids are forcing and need not be biddable. 4C over 1H or 1S shows a raise to game which includes two aces. 4D similarly shows three aces. 5 NT Grand Slam force. Kock Werner S.O.S. redoubles. 1S dbl. 2 NT shows a normal raise to 3S. Over opposing three bids, the lowest available suit is for a take-out (Fishbein). Lead ace from ace-king.
