Paul and John Spurway have made quite a name for themselves in the bridge world during the past few years. Winners of Crockfords Cup this year, they also have the unique distinction of having been runners-up in the National Pairs Championship two years in succession. They played for England against Wales last year.

Mrs. Higginson and Mrs. Edwards formed their partnership quite by chance during the European Trials, and combined so well that they have been chosen to play for Great Britain in the European Championships in Palermo. Mrs. Higginson is one of the strongest players in the North West, whilst Mrs. Edwards commands a regular place in the Surrey county team.

# THE EIRE TEAM (Team 2)

Jonas T. Waldron, who will be non-playing captain, is the new president of the C.B.A.I.

- D. Pigot and J. McHale are two of Eire's youngest and most promising players. Holders of the Irish Bridge League's team championship, they were also runners-up in their National Pairs championship.
- P. Fellows and J. Wallis have been consistent performers in most of Eire's major events over the past few years, and won this year's Panel Test against a strong field.

THE NORTHERN IRELAND TEAM (Team 3)

Irish International and European Championship player, David Cohen has ben playing in top class bridge for many years. A popular figure in Wales, he is further renowned for his after-dinner speeches, of which he usually manages two or three during the evening.

In Crosgar, his home town, Johnny McRobert is called "The Laird," but in bridge circles he is more popularly known as "The 3-No Trumper"—a favourite contract at which he enjoys considerable success.

H. A. Schenker, another Camrose player, is present holder of the All-Ireland Pairs Championship. Miss Ida Frazer, president of the N.I.B.U., has the distinction of being the first certificated bridge teacher in Northern Ireland—we look forward to a free lesson.
