#### Editorial

Rewriting a constitution is a wearing task. There have been many criticisms of the existing Welsh Bridge Union constitution: frequent lack of clarity on important issues causes lengthy arguments whenever the contentious point is raised; there are occasional logical inconsistencies; time has overtaken some items (how many know of the Welsh Patron, or of the bankruptcy clause for Council members?); and established practice within the Union conflicts in several cases with the Constitution. More than one attempt to re-write the Constitution has been made but foundered on the same rock: the reviser has included at least one amendment opposed strongly by significant factions within the Union. It is much easier to defeat amendments than to carry them, and the whole exercise has fallen at the same moment.

This time around the Union has made a greater effort to achieve harmony. Two years ago a sub-committee was appointed with representatives from each Area to propose a new Constitution which had a healthy chance of support from all parts of Wales. The first draft suffered over a hundred adjustments before the sub-committee felt able to submit to Council and the Area Committees. Over the intervening year many more revisions were made. Then at its December meeting the Council agreed the wording for submission to members.

As far as members are concerned the main changes are:
to define the act of club affiliation (not mentioned in the
current Constitution yet it is a foundation of the Union);
to simplify the eligibility rules for membership (in future
anyone could apply; those who do not belong to an affiliated
club would apply direct to the WBU Secretary);
to make the rules regarding subs conform with established
practice; and
to tighten the rules on selector eligibility (a selector will
not be permitted to represent Wales in the same season.)
