NEWSLETTER No 35 Autumn 1990

Editorial:

The WBU adopts the EBU 'Yellow Book' with a list of allowed systems. This year the EBU have a different method, with the 'Yellow Book' Part 1 for Directives and Part 2 the 'Green Book' for Licensing of Conventions. There is a big change under the new method and players are advised to study the new books. This year's 'Yellow Book' is already with clubs and the 'Green Book' effective from 13th October 1990 should be shortly.

Under the new basis for licensing, system names have gone and been replaced by licences which cover opening bids and responses. These include all those in the main systems which were licensed in the 1989 book. For example I had a phone call from someone who played Nottingham Club and was worried that 1D could not now be bid on a 4 4 14 hand but this is covered under 1D opening (e).

We have reference to the rule of 19 (minimum for an opening bid) and rule of 12(for responses). These figures are arrived at by adding the number of High Card Points to the number of cards in the two longest suits. Note also the restrictions attached to the Multi 2D at the General Licence level.

Certain well known conventions may be described on the convention card by name only if they are played exactly as described, but a detailed explanation must be given on the convention card of any other conventions. Information must not be available to partner which is not available to opponents. 'Optional' must not be used to describe defence to pre-empts when X is for take-out. 'Optional' indicates a strong balanced hand.

Please note that all conventional bids should now be alerted at any level (not just up to 3NT). At the commencement of a round players should ascertain opponents basic system, strength of NT, meaning of 2C response to 1NT, leads, signals and discards.

NATIONAL TOURNAMENT ORGANISER'S REPORT

The Journal has now been printed and distributed to the clubs. Congress results do not appear this year as many were not sent to the NTO. Could all congress secretaries please send results to Jessie Newton and Paul Chimes for inclusion in the Newsletter and Journal respectively,

The draw for the Gold, Welsh and Cambria Cups was made at the Veterans Pairs and the draw has been distributed to the team captains. Any captain who has not received a copy should contact me IMMEDIATELY.

Entries for the following pairs competitions should be sent to the NTO by the dates indicated: International Masters - 31.10.90, Graded Masters - 31.1.91, Portland Pairs (£9.50 per player) - 28.2.91.

There has been a tendency up to now for many late entries to be received for events. This makes it difficult to make arrangements with venues and to prepare movements. Please note that in future, entries MUST be in by the closing date specified.

It is a requirement that all players carry a convention card. Please make sure that you ALWAYS have one for national events.

It has been decided that places in the final of the Webber Cup will be allocated according to the following rule:

The winners of each heat will be guaranteed a place in the final. Spare places will be allocated in turn to the heats with the highest remaining percentage of non-qualifying teams (heats may be allocated more than one spare place). The allocation of marginal places to heats of equal standing will be decided by lot.
