Devolution

In June this year the European Bridge League agreed that Wales, England and Scotland should each become National Federations to replace the previous arrangement whereby The British Bridge League represented all three as a National Federation.

This change in status has many implications for the WBU. We will now be able to send our own representatives to European and World events, whereas before very few Welsh players were selected by the BBL. There will be major financial changes with the WBU taking on an extra burden of financing international representatives, but also gaining income from the dissolution of the BBL.

Below is an extract from a statement from the WBU Council, which has been circulated to clubs and can be seen in full on the WBU Website.

"Your Council has been planning how the WBU will fulfil its new status responsibly. The first step was to obtain new income from sources other than its own members to avoid extra burden on them if possible. That job has been successfully completed. The BBL is to be replaced by a smaller body to run the Home Internationals, and Gold Cup (British knockout-teams-of-four). This body will not have to finance British teams as before, so money-raising events previously run by the BBL could be used to assist the Home Unions fulfil their new status. Your delegates at the BBL were able to reach an agreement, which received the unanimous support of your Council at its July meeting this year:

- The one BBL Congress held within Wales, namely the BBL Swiss Teams in Llangollen, would come within the control of the WBU, who could use the extra income to meet the new obligations;
- 2. The BBL Simultaneous Pairs, which would continue to be run by the new body, would have a substantial profit. As the obligation of fielding representatives within European and World events would fall equally upon the three new National Federations it was mutually agreed that each should receive an equal share of the surplus, after the new body had retained one quarter to meet its own needs. This was a very fair agreement to reach. The share the WBU will receive is based on the understanding with the EBU and SBU that it is for the purpose of supporting Welsh representation within EBL and WBF events. Your Council is of the opinion that to use this new income for any other purpose would threaten the agreement reached with the EBU and SBU.
- 3. The 1-day Events in August would continue as now with the WBU having the right to receive the levy for heats within Wales, which previously went to the BBL.
- 4. The monies received from licenses for overseas holidays would be administered in such a way that the share received by the WBU would remain much the same.

A STATEMENT FROM THE WBU LAWS AND ETHICS COMMITTEE

At an enquiry held on 12th November 1999 the WBU Laws & Ethics Committee found:

- 1. That on four separate occasions during the 1999 Welsh Foursomes, Mr. A. Haworth substituted for the cards provided by the organisers a pack of cards prepared by himself and dealt from such prepared pack, contrary to Law 6 of the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge; and that on each occasion the resulting deal was played in the match.
- 2. That such conduct by Mr. Haworth amounted to unfair play, and as such constituted an offence under clause XVIII B (1) (a) of the Constitution of the Welsh Bridge Union.
- 3. That Mr. Haworth had admitted the offence, and in answer to questioning had indicated that nobody else had had knowledge of his actions.

It was decided:

- 1. That Mr. Haworth be suspended from membership of the Union for a period of ten years from 23rd November 1999
- 2. That the findings of fact and the decision of the Committee should be published in the Welsh Bridge Union *Newsletter*.
- 3. That the decision of the Committee should be promulgated as follows:-
- (a) to the four areas of the Welsh Bridge Union;
- (b) to the British Bridge League for international promulgation; and
- (c) to the English Bridge Union, the Scottish Bridge Union and the Northern Ireland Bridge Union, and to the Avon Contract Bridge Association.

Note - the effect of the suspension, within Wales, is that Mr Haworth is precluded from playing in:-

- (a) any WBU event
- (b) any WBU area event
- (c) any BBL event (or any event sponsored by its successor organisation)
- (d) any other event open only to WBU members

Master Point of View

There have been so many problems with our newsletters lately that in this one I'm just catching up. (I think after Patrick Jourdain wrote that one of the benefits of WBU membership was the Quarterly Newsletter the Gremlins could not resist the temptation to interfere with our system.)

Everyone else has probably forgotten the April master point year-end but it's a time, which embeds itself into my memory, partly due to the work, and partly from the nagging I get not to work too late in the evening. So first I'd like to give a rather belated thanks to everyone (almost everyone!) for not waiting until the last minute of the year-end before sending in his or her points. Mail arrived steadily from the end of March and all through April, and I never went to bed feeling overwhelmed by what waited for me in the morning. Oddly though, I received a hundred more letters than in 1997/98 but registered fewer points. For the mathematically minded, in 1998/1999 we earned only 2,246,386 locals, and 4744 greens, compared with last years 2,361,239 locals, and 4,935 greens. And this with ever more bridge!

Of course, after year-end I always get a few phone calls asking "Is it too late?" I consider this the bridge equivalent of forgetting to put the clock back.

I remember that one morning I received not a letter but a prettily wrapped parcel. Thinking it was a late Christmas present, (this was April!) I opened it to see what looked like a tasty meal, Chicken Kiev and some cereal; but on closer inspection the cereal turned out to be Tiger cat food, and then both boxes proved to contain master points. Not too disappointing, for from the "fragrance" lingering in one packet I don't think I would have liked the duck, rabbit and vegetable cat food. In fact, I'm surprised the cat did.

In the last Newsletter we had I mentioned that points had a shelf life of three years. This started something of a scavenger hunt; cupboards, drawers pockets, wallets, handbags, shoes, and vases obviously being searched and emptied, for I received a surge of letters containing previously neglected old points. I checked my mail books and found I had never before had so many letters in the month after year-end. I was even sent some EBU points from 1972, not in hope of them being registered, but because the member concerned could not bear to destroy them himself. I could not either.

Some points have problems getting to me even while they are still young. One lady told me that to make sure she had enough points for her next promotion, she visited a friend to have her arithmetic checked. All was correct and she left her friend's house quite delighted. Before she could get into her car, however, a sudden strong gust of wind tore the points from her hand and whisked them away. A nearby school was turning out, and the children, seeing her distress, were soon rushing everywhere collecting the little slips for her. Amazingly, all were recovered, and the promotion achieved.

I told this story when I was playing one day and another member told me that she used to keep her points in the pocket of her car door until one day the wind grabbed them to play with.

E-mail queries are proving very efficient, so for all those of you with computers, I can recommend it. Although I must say it's always nice to chat on the phone.

As what should have been the Summer Newsletter disappeared into space (pre-Millennium bug?) there will be two separate promotion lists in this one. The first covers the year-end promotions, and also promotions made up to 5th of July; the second covers all promotions from 6th July until 20th November so quite a few members should see themselves with a higher rank than in the Journal listing. If you expected a promotion in early July, especially from directly credited points, I recommend you check both lists.

I heard more about the oldest Welsh Bridge player: Wilson Warhurst playing at Llandudno club at 99. I'm told the invigorating Llandudno air is probably responsible for the number of players over ninety there.

The full Gold Points listing was produced just after the year-end, and the editor has promised to find space for it in this newsletter, which should be a bumper issue. Having been assured that it will escape the delays of the last two or three, I should like to wish everyone a merry Christmas and a happy New Year. But I'm not mentioning Millennium celebrations so as not to upset those who believe the next century does not start until January 1st, 2001.

The Camrose Home International Matches

Wales is to host three Home International matches this season. The first will probably be over before this Newsletter reaches you. That is the match against England to be played in Newport on December 4th and 5th. The next will be Wales v Scotland to be hosted by the North Wales Bridge Association in the St George's Hotel, The Promenade, Llandudno on January 8th and 9th. The third event is the Junior Camrose and Peggy Bayer Competitions between Wales, England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland to be played in The Rest at Porthcawl on 29th and 30th January.

Anyone is allowed to watch a Camrose match. There are two ways in which this can be done. You are permitted to sit behind the players in the Open Room, but you can also follow what is going on from the Viewgraph Room. Here you can view the play from the Closed Room on closed circuit television and listen to expert commentary on the play and the bidding. In the last Camrose match held in Wales computer graphics were used to display the bidding and the play.

I spent most of that Camrose weekend locked away in the office grappling with the scoring, and only managed to see one or two hands on Viewgraph. Sunday's final session had started with the scores at Wales 22.5 VP Northern Ireland 17 VP and when I popped in to the viewgraph room when there were just 10 boards to play Wales held a 2 imp lead in the final session. Keith Pratt 1948-1999

Keith Pratt, who died suddenly aged 50, was due to be captain of the Wales bridge team against England just ten days later. Pratt had nine internationals for Wales including the last victory of Wales over England.

He died on the very day that his wife, Barbara, and daughter, Rebecca, featured in an hour-long BBC television exposé of the modelling agency business. Rebecca was a courageous whistle-blower in the programme and Barbara said later: "I am sorry that Keith did not see the documentary; he would have been really proud of his daughter."

Keith was born on Boxing Day, 1948 in Malden, Surrey, and lived in Berkshire for some time before moving to Lancashire where he met and married Barbara. They had two children, Rebecca and Ben. In 1979 he moved to Porthcawl. He was an accountant with Ford in Bridgend and was promoted to a senior management post earlier this year.

His early partner in Welsh bridge was Dilys Clare but he and Tony Haworth were first selected for Wales in February 1991 for the match against Scotland in Anglesey, a narrow loss. His nine matches for Wales included the Llandudno win over England in 1996, the first for 19 years.

Keith was a jovial fellow, with a laid-back easy-going approach to the game that is rare at international level. This made him a popular and genial team-mate. His generous personality and readiness with a joke will be sorely missed.


The clubs broke 3-2 and we made an overtrick.

If in seventh position the INT opener's partner wishes to play in a suit contract there must be a way of doing so. Are there any 'wriggle' experts out there who can tell us the solution? I suspect that all bids would be natural in seventh position. I also suspect that there are about twenty different systems described as 'the wriggle'.

LAWS AND ETHICS

Changes to the Orange Book 1998

- Following the annual review by the EBU L&EC, the following changes apply from Sept 1st 1999
 Mattos 2NT response to one-of-a-suit opening bids: This shows game try values with a void in partner's bid suit. This is now permitted at Level 3 and should be added to item 13.2.2. on the Orange book 1998.
- The playing of lead directing overcalls (i. e. not showing length at all) may be played, but no conventions may be played thereafter. Thus the second bulleted point of items 12.12.1, 13.6.1, and 14.9.1 should be changed to read:
 - "You may overcall either on 3 cards, or solely to show strength in the suit bid rather than length, by agreement, but only if you do not play any conventional bids thereafter."

Annual reviews are carried out in the early part of each year. If any member of the **WBU** wishes to have presented to the **EBU** any convention they have devised with a view to categorising it they should forward it via the WBU Secretary to the **Chairman of the WBU L&EC** before January 1st each year.

Submissions should be clearly written, typed if possible, on A4 paper. It is necessary to include a logical defence to your convention and also an indication of how it is to be shown on the convention card.

Players submitting conventions for consideration must enclose a cheque for £12 made payable to the EBU. This cheque will be refunded if the convention is not considered suitable for submission by the **WBU**. (The money is an EBU charge for administration)
